

## Parent Survey - Autumn 2020


## UKS2 Parents' Evenings

My child has settled in well to the new school year.


My child has settled in well to the new school year.

## My child is happy in school.


My child is happy in school.

We are pleased, like you at just how well the children have settled into the new school year and of the relationships, friendships that they have established.

As children move through the school, homework is progressive and there is an expectation in UKS2 that children complete Maths, English, Spelling and Reading homework each week as per our school policy to help ensure they are ready for the expectations of homework and independent study as they get to High School. Websites and Apps such as Times Table Rockstars and Spelling Frame are not to be seen as additional homework but instead as different approaches to learning spellings etc throughout the week. We recognise that many children utilise technology at home so want to make the revision of basic skills as fun and as engaging as possible for them.

As a school, we try very hard to ensure children do not feel any pressure towards the SATs tests and ensure that children in Year 6 have a full curriculum offer – not just Maths and English. We do, of course, have high expectations of the children but ensure that work is carefully balanced. Bespoke interventions are in place across UKS2 to support children where they may need support but these are short, 20 minute sessions which are timetabled to ensure children still receive a full curriculum offer. Further opportunity to discuss the end of key stage assessments is provided at our assessment evening in the Spring term and Y6 staff are always available for a telephone conversation or socially distanced meeting where appropriate to support.
